- 1. Complete or partial IGETC certification of coursework is certified by the last California community college attended for a regular (fall or spring) semester prior to transfer. Students should request certification at the time when <u>final</u> transcripts are sent to the transfer institution. Partial certification is defined as completing all but two (2) courses on the IGETC pattern. **Warning**: Students need Area 1 and 2 completed to meet minimum transfer admission requirements.
- 2. Courses may be listed in more than one area, but can be certified in only one area except for courses in languages other than English, which can be certified in both areas 3B and 6A. *Indicates that transfer credit may be limited by either UC or CSU or both. Please consult with a counselor for additional information.
- 3. Advanced Placement credit exam scores of 3, 4, or 5 can be used to meet IGETC subject areas and English Composition, <u>but not Critical</u> <u>Thinking</u>. Contact individual UC campus for application of advanced placement credit toward major requirements.

CAMPUS SPECIFIC IGETC INFORMATION

- The IGETC is a general education program that California Community College students can use to fulfill lower division (freshman-sophomore) general education requirements for any CSU or UC campus and many California private colleges/universities.
- The IGETC provides an alternative to the General Education-Breadth requirements for CSU, UC, and many California private colleges/universities.
- The IGETC is NOT an admission requirement for the CSU or UC nor does completion of the IGETC guarantee admission to the campus or program of choice.
- Complete or partial IGETC certification of coursework is certified by the last California community college attended for a regular (fall or spring) semester prior to transfer. Students should request certification at the time when <u>final</u> transcripts are sent to the transfer institution. Partial certification is defined as completing all but two (2) courses on the IGETC pattern. **Warning**: Students need Area 1 and 2 completed to meet minimum transfer admission requirements.
- To be certified all courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.
- A grade of "CR" (credit) or "P" (pass) may be used if the grading policy of the community college states that "CR" or "P" is equivalent to a grade of "C" or better. The UC will allow no more than 14 semester units taken CR/P toward UC eligibility or IGETC. The CSU campuses vary on the number of units they allow. Please check each college's catalog or see a counselor for more information.
- Courses may be used only once to satisfy one subject area even if they are listed in more than one subject area.
- Advanced Placement (AP): A score of 3, 4, or 5 is required to grant credit for IGETC certification AP exam may not clear Critical Thinking (Area 1B).
- All IGETC coursework does not have to be completed at the same college. Courses taken at more than one California Community College may be used to fulfill the IGETC. Note, however, that courses applicable to IGETC may vary from college to college.
- The IGETC is not a good option for students intending to transfer into high unit majors, such as Engineering or the Sciences, which require extensive lower division preparation.
- Please see a counselor to make sure that the IGETC is appropriate for your use or if you have any other questions regarding the IGETC.

The following list specifies the various majors, by campus, that have substantial lower division prerequisites that may make the IGETC option inappropriate for transfer students to follow. The most up-to-date information regarding the acceptance of IGETC at specific colleges in each UC is available in the UC Answers for Transfers booklet in the Transfer Center or online at www.ucop.edu/pathways/:

UC BERKELEY: <u>Colleges of Chemistry and Engineering</u> – in general, IGETC is **not** appropriate; <u>College of Environmental Design</u> – IGETC is acceptable with full certification to fulfill CED's breadth requirements; <u>College of Letters and Science</u> – Either IGETC or the college's requirements are acceptable; <u>College of Natural Resources</u> – IGETC is acceptable; however specific lower division major requirements must still be satisfied; <u>Haas School of Business</u> – IGETC is **not** accepted.

UC DAVIS: All undergraduate colleges accept IGETC. However, Bachelor of Science degrees and high-unit majors often have many courses for lowerdivision preparation; in these cases, IGETC is **not** recommended and the UC Davis general education pattern is the better choice.

UC IRVINE: All schools accept IGETC. However, selection by the campus is based on demonstrated academic achievement and preparation for the intended major.

UC LOS ANGELES: All Schools accept IGETC except The Henry Samueli School of Engineering and Applied Science.

UC MERCED: <u>School of Engineering and School of Natural Sciences</u> – IGETC is **not** recommended; <u>School of Social Sciences</u>, <u>Humanities</u>, <u>and Arts</u> – IGETC is recommended, and students are encouraged to complete as much lower-division major preparation as possible prior to transfer.

UC RIVERSIDE: <u>College of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences</u> – IGETC is recommended; <u>College of Natural and Agricultural Sciences</u> – IGETC is not accepted; <u>The Marlan and Rosemary Bourns College of Engineering</u> – IGETC is accepted, some additional coursework may be required after enrollment; <u>School of Business Administration</u> – IGETC is required.

UC SAN DIEGO: <u>John Muir, Earl Warren, Thurgood Marshall and Sixth Colleges</u> – IGETC is accepted; <u>Eleanor Roosevelt and Revelle Colleges</u> – IGETC is accepted; some additional coursework may be required after enrollment

UC SANTA BARBARA: <u>College of Creative Studies and College of Letters and Science</u> – IGETC is accepted; <u>College of Engineering</u> – Students are encouraged to focus on major preparation rather than general education. IGETC may be used to substitute for most general education requirements. However, some additional coursework may be required after enrollment to complete the depth requirement if not satisfied during IGETC certification.

UC SANTA CRUZ: For majors in the physical and biological sciences or the *Jack Baskin School of Engineering*, IGETC is **not** recommended. Students should ensure completion of lower-division courses for their intended major.
