1. An Associate in Arts in Social Work and Human Services for Transfer degree, is designed for students who plan to complete a Bachelor's degree in a similar major at a CSU campus. The degree will acquaint students with the fundamentals of the human services system and the profession of Social Work, including introduction to the theories, principles, and values on which human services are offered and social work is practiced in the United States
