



**Please read the following information before submitting an Appeal for Independent Status. Federal regulations state that a student is considered independent for financial aid if he or she can answer yes to any one of the following questions:**

- Were you born before January 1, 1993?
- As of today, are you married? (Answer "Yes" if you are separated but not divorced.)
- At the beginning of the 2016-2017 school year, will you be working on a master's or doctorate program (such as an MA, MBA, MD, JD, PhD, EdD, or graduate certificate, etc.)?
- Are you currently serving on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces for purposes other than training?
- Are you a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces?
- Do you have children who will receive more than half of their support from you between July 1, 2016 and June 30, 2017?
- Do you have dependents (other than your children or spouse) who live with you and who receive more than half of their support from you, now and through June 30, 2017?
- When you were age 13 or older, were both your parents deceased, were you in foster care or were you a dependent/ward of the court?
- As of today, are you or were you an emancipated minor as determined by a court in your state of legal residence?
- As of today, are you or were you in legal guardianship as determined by a court in your state of legal residence?
- At any time on or after July 1, 2015, did your high school or school district homeless liaison determine that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless?
- At any time on or after July 1, 2015, did the director of an emergency shelter program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development determine that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless?
- At any time on or after July 1, 2015, did the director of a runaway or homeless youth basic center or transitional living program determine that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or were self-supporting and at risk of being homeless?

If you do not meet any of the criteria listed above and feel your circumstances warrant review for independent status, please complete the form, type your statements, and obtain all the documentation that is required.

Decisions made will be valid for the current school year. Note: A student is ***not considered independent*** solely on:

- self-sufficiency
- a parent's unwillingness to provide information
- a parent's unwillingness to assist with educational expenses
- a parent not claiming the student as a dependent for income tax purposes

**After you have completed the form entirely, typed your statement(s) and obtained your third party documentation, call the Financial Aid Office at (559) 442-8245 to make an "APPEAL FOR INDEPENDENT STATUS" appointment to have your request reviewed.**
