The Basic Police Academy Certificate of Achievement program offers curriculum to prepare students with the knowledge and skills necessary to complete a law enforcement field training program certified by the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST). Employment opportunities are found in both government and private enterprise where law enforcement principles are applied.

The basic academy is offered in three different formats: the intensive 40 hours per week format, the 24 hour per week night academy extended format, and the modular format. Hours per week may vary slightly according to schedule.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

To qualify for the program, applicants must:

1. Be 18 years of age
2. Valid California Driver's License
3. Have a high school diploma or G.E.D.
4. Be in good academic/progress standing with the college (if on academic probation, you must receive clearance from the FCC counseling department)
5. Pass the POST PELLET-B Work Sample Test Battery and Physical Agility Testing

Applicants must attend an interview and orientation, and will be notified regarding their acceptance. Accepted applicants must:

1. Possess a valid California Driver's License and provide a DMV printout of their driving record.
2. Provide a Department of Justice clearance for firearms possession.
3. Provide proof of a physical examination including an Electrocardiogram with the physician's approval for applicant to participate in all aspects of academy training.

Notes:

1. Some of the above courses may have prerequisites. See the catalog or schedule of classes.
2. The *Certificate of Achievement* requires completion of the major (21.5-37 units) with a "C" or better grade in each course.
