Students must complete one of the three different general education patterns: option 1 Fresno City College General Education, option 2 CSU GE Breadth– California State University General Education, OR option 3 IGETC Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum for a total of **60 semester units minimum** with a 2.0 or better GPA.
