Notes:

- 1. Students Transferring from the Police Academy, candidates who have completed the Basic Academy, or the Reserve Level 1 program may request to waive 6 units from the following courses in the Criminology degree program: Criminology 1, 6, 7, 12. To process this, candidates must complete a course waiver form and attach a copy of the Certificate from the Police Academy or a copy of their transcript. Forms are available in the Social Sciences Division office. The waiver form is then signed by the dean of Social Science and by the dean of Admissions and Records.
- 2. The Associate Degree requires completion of the major (31 units) with a "C" or better grade in each course. Students must complete one of the three different general education patterns: option 1 Fresno City College General Education, option 2 CSU GE Breadth– California State University General Education, OR option 3 IGETC Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum for a total of **60 semester units minimum** with a 2.0 or better GPA.
