**Notes:**

1. This degree is designed for students interested in working in the field of chemical dependency. Completion of the total program will broaden a candidate’s understanding and assist in preparation needed to enter the field. These core classes of the degree are accredited by the California Association for Alcohol/Drug Educators (CAADE) and recognized by the other counselor certification organizations in California. The degree offers course work leading to a certificate of achievement, and an AS degree in Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counseling.
2. Some of the above courses may have prerequisites. See the catalog or schedule of classes.
3. \*\*HS 42 is a prerequisite to HS 43, and HS 43 is a prerequisite to HS 19B.
4. The *Associate Degree* requires completion of the major (38-39 units) with a “C” or better grade in each course. Students must complete one of the three different general education patterns: option 1 – Fresno City College General Education, option 2 – CSU GE Breadth– California State University General Education, OR option 3 – IGETC – Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum for a total of **60 semester units minimum** with a 2.0 or better GPA.
