**Notes:**

1. The Elementary Teacher Education Associate of Arts for Transfer Degree is designed for students planning to transfer to a four-year university ready to continue for a bachelor's degree in Liberal Studies and a preliminary Multiple Subject Elementary Teaching Credential.
2. A GPA of 2.67 or higher overall, or 2.75 or higher in the last 60 units, are required for the credential programs at California State University, Fresno.
3. LING 11 and MATH 10B are no longer listed in the major. Students intending to transfer to CSU Fresno should take these two classes as part of the four units needed to complete the degree unit requirements.
4. Some of the above courses may have prerequisites. See the catalog or schedule of classes.
5. The *Associate Degree for Transfer* requires completion of the major (52-56 units) with a "C" or better grade in each course plus the completion of the General Education requirements (either CSU GE Breadth or IGETC CSU) for a total of **60 CSU-transferable semester units minimum** with a 2.0 or better GPA.
6. Some courses may not have an associated C-ID, please see catalog or counselor for more information.

**Additional advisement for K-12 teaching and/or substitute teaching:**

Students wishing to become K-12 teachers and substitute teachers may now use specified coursework completed with a grade of B or higher in lieu of or in conjunction with the CBEST to demonstrate proficiency in the basic skills of reading, writing, and math.

The CCTC has stated that qualifying coursework taken at a community college would fulfill this basic skills demonstration of proficiency. Coursework must meet all the following requirements:

- Courses must have been taken at a regionally accredited college or university for credit
- Passed with a grade of B or better
- Be degree applicable, and
- At least 3 semester units (or equivalent quarter units)

Qualifying coursework does not include professional development or continuing education units or in-service training or workshops.

**Qualifying coursework includes:**

- For reading proficiency: a course in critical thinking, literature, philosophy, reading, rhetoric, or textual analysis.
- For writing proficiency: a course in composition, English, rhetoric, written communication, or writing.
- For mathematics proficiency: a course in algebra, geometry, mathematics, quantitative reasoning, or statistics.

A course that does not fall within the indicated areas may still qualify with additional letter of explanation from the registrar or relevant department chair of the college or university. This must state that a course passed by the applicant covered reading, writing, or mathematics at the same level as one of the listed courses. Such a letter could also attest that a single course sufficiently indicates proficiency in reading and writing combined.
