**Notes:**

1. Administration of Justice is the study of the causes, consequences, and control of crime. The program is designed to acquaint students with the principles and practices of criminal justice systems in America. The curriculum allows for the development of depth in one of the subject's subsystems (law enforcement, juvenile, courts, or corrections), and also gain familiarity with the basics of all areas. It is both academic and professional in that it is an interdisciplinary attempt to relate intellectual issues and practitioner perspectives to the challenge of crime in a free society. It provides the information necessary for employment with a related agency and/or transfer to a college or university.
2. Some of the above courses may have prerequisites. See the catalog or schedule of classes.
3. The *Associate Degree for Transfer* requires completion of the major (18-20 units) with a "C" or better grade in each course plus the completion of the General Education requirements (either CSU GE Breadth or IGETC) for a total of **60 CSU-transferable semester units minimum** with a 2.0 or better GPA.
